Hypertensive emergency. Hypertensive crisis (or hypertensive emergency) is the turning point in the course of hypertension when the immediate management of elevated blood pressure plays a decisive role in limiting or preventing target organ damage.

Hypertensive urgency is not an emergency and its management is much less aggressive (see below). Diagnosis of a hypertensive emergency requires rapid intervention to lower BP in the emergency department (e.g. IV nitroprusside, IV labetalol, or IV nicardipine) .

## **Hypertensive Crisis Symptoms, Causes, Treatments**

Of the 670 patients, 57.5% had hypertensive emergencies; 98% of those with hypertensive emergencies and 23.2% of those with hypertensive urgencies were hospitalized. Median survival was 14 days for those with neurovascular emergencies and 50 days for those with cardiovascular emergencies.

## **Hypertensive Emergencies: Uncontrolled Blood Pressure**

Hypertensive Emergency If your blood pressure reading is 180/120 or greater and you are experiencing any other associated symptoms of target organ damage such as chest pain, shortness of breath, back pain, numbness/weakness, change in vision, or difficulty speaking then this would be considered a hypertensive emergency.
